The original muckrakers were a core group of about fifteen journalists writing for McClure ’ s Magazine in the first part of the 20th century. Among other topics, they took on corporate power, the big trusts, and government corruption.

In its heyday, between 1903 and 1906, muckraking journalism was ubiquitous, urgent, influential. The " interests " (what we call today " special interests " ) threatened the commonweal; the press attacked the interests.
